Re: 2022-2024 Conservation and Load Management Plan – Condition of Approval #7

Dear Mr. Chaudry and Mr. Sullivan:

On June 1, 2022, the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) approved the 2022-2024 Conservation and Load Management Plan (C&LM Plan), subject to conditions.¹ The C&LM Plan was submitted by Eversource Energy (Eversource), The United Illuminating Company (UI), Connecticut Natural Gas Corporation, and The Southern Connecticut Gas Company (collectively, the Utilities), on November 1, 2021, pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 16-245m, in consultation with the Connecticut Energy Efficiency Board.

Condition of Approval #7 states:

With the understanding that UI is currently working to develop a new data management system, they are directed to take the following interim steps to improve the quality and timeliness of their evaluation data:

- *Produce an accurate data dictionary for review by the Evaluation Administrator prior to the September 12, 2022 Evaluation Committee meeting.*
- *Work with the Evaluation Administrator to produce standard data requests for impact and process evaluations, with accurate variable names, suitable for every major program.*

On September 8, 2022, UI submitted an extension of time to file to October 3, 2022.² DEEP approves this request for extension. UI should file its response to Condition of Approval #7 with DEEP on October
